Republican Bills to follow and write and call about

H.R.367 Called the "Hearing Protection Act" This bill provides that gun silencers be treated the same as long guns. Removes power from the states in regard to gun silencers. *Presented in the House, to the House Ways and Means Committee, now in . Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations Cosponsored by Brat, Whitman, Griffin, Garrett and Comstock from VA*

H.R.610 To distribute Federal Funds for elementary and secondary education in the form of vouchers for eligible students and to repeal a certain rule relating to nutrition standards in the schools. *(The active words here are "eligible" and "certain)* (Introduced not acted on yet)

H.R. 899 To terminate the Department of Education on December 31, 2018. Introduced by Thomas Massie (R-KY) (In House Committee on Education and the Workplace)

H.R. 861 To terminate the Environmental Protection Agency as of December 31, 2018. This was introduced by Rep. Matt Gaetz (R-FL) This bill was introduced on Feb. 3, 2017 and has been a lot of committees since then. It is currently in the Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment. Action By: House Science, Space, and Technology.

H.R.1430- Actually called "The Honest Act" (Passed house now in the Senate) - the Honest and Open New EPA Science Treatment Act, labelled H.R. 1430 in the House, would prevent the EPA from "proposing, finalizing, or disseminating" any regulation unless the science cited is "the best available science," "specifically identified," publicly available online, and reproducible. The legislation was introduced by Rep. Lamar Smith (R-TX21), chair of the House Science Committee. (Just another tool to say there is no global warming or other health standards that business has to comply to. ---Both Dave Brat and Rob Whitman voted Yes on this bill)

H.J. Resolution 10 (Introduced and now in Foreign Affairs Committee) This resolution is actually an Authorization of Use of Force Against Iran. It authorizes the President to use the U.S. Armed Forces as necessary in order to prevent Iran from obtaining nuclear weapons without consent from congress. The President does have to let them know he did this within 60 days. (What can go wrong?) **PASSED This bill unfortunately passed and is now law. NOW THE LAW........**H.J.Res.69 - Open Hunting In National Wildlife Refugees in Alaska.

BILL TO SUPPORT (Call Your Representatives)

Democratic Bill H.R. 669 Restricting First Use of Nuclear Weapons Act of 2017 This bill prohibits the President from using the Armed Forces to conduct a first-use nuclear strike unless such strike is conducted pursuant to a congressional declaration of war expressly authorizing such strike. "First-use nuclear strike" means a nuclear weapons attack against an enemy that is conducted without the President determining that the enemy has first launched a nuclear strike against the United States or a U.S. ally.
