MARCH PROGRAM -SUICIDE PREVENTION

Our special Sunday meeting focused on mental health with an outstanding presentation by Alan Rasmussen, who heads the Suicide Prevention Office of the Rappahannock-Rapidan Community Services Board. Those in attendance at the March 16th event included Sheriff Mark Amos, former Virginia State Senator, **Butch Davies and District** Five Supervisor, Lee Frame and Deborah Pulaski, mental health counselor. who was available for private conversations following the presentation. All who attended were encouraged to become advocates for mental health education and suicide prevention.

Alan is a well-known and popular speaker whose passion for suicide prevention is contagious. PROGRAM ((ONT.)

He began his presentation with several startling statistics. Suicide claims 30,000 lives each year; Over half of suicides occur in adult men ages 25-65; Suicide is the third leading cause of death in15-24 year olds and the fifth leading cause in 50-14 year olds. The strongest risk factor for suicide is depression. On average, a suicide occurs every fifteen minutes.

Alan's suicide prevention training focuses on QPR

(Question - Persuade-Refer)
"Ask a question. Save a life."
This program was written by
Dr. Paul Quinnett and is the
foundation for formal suicide
prevention training. Alan
encouraged the audience to
attend the upcoming Mental
Health First Aid classes to be
held in Fredericksburg
beginning in May.

LOOK! A BOOK

Ever have a book on the shelf that nags at you? You paid your own good money for it, know you ought to read it, even know you'll be glad when you do read it, and yet you keep edging away from it until you're sliding over toward the mystery shelf? Well, I can now say with a righteous smile, "I did it!" The book is What's the Matter with Kansas? By Thomas Frank, published 2004. Dr. Frank got his P.H.D. in History from the University of Chicago, attended the University of Virginia and the University of Kansas.

The book is about the shifts in our political parties that have so many of us scratching our heads and questioning our hearing and memories and I.Q.'s. We're asking, "How did this happen?" What makes Republicans run maniacally to the right like lemmings to the cliff and sends Democrats cowering and saying, "Please don't hurt me, I'm not a liberal, just a moderate progressive."

I don't want to scare anybody off, but the first half of the book takes a little more effort to get through and skips around quite a bit. Concepts like cultural backlash, anti-Americanism, cooperate conspiracies, Reaganism, educational policy wars, etc. are all alluded to and without enough detail to make a smooth transition from paragraph. But hang in, the second half is worth working toward.

One of the biggest mysteries discussed at length in this book is why Americans are so willing to accept the legitimacy of statements promoted by the propaganda machines of the Republican party. This is where a lot of Kansas history comes in to try to explain just What is the matter with Kansas. At first it seemed like there was just too much Civil War stuff, farm support laws, regulation and deregulation issues going on, and as usual my eyes glazed over a bit until a few pages later when I came across the quote:

"Out here the gravity of discontent pulls in only one direction -- to the right, to the right, farther to the right. Strip today's Kansans of their iob security, and they head out to become registered Republicans. Push them off their land, and next thing you know they're protesting in front of abortion clinics. Squander their life savings on manicures for the CEO, and there's a good chance they'll join the John Birch Society. But ask them about the remedies their ancestors proposed (unions, antitrust, public ownership) and you might as well be referring to the days when knighthood was in flower."

As I got further along in the book, I gave up trying to figure out why pro labor citizens in a state(and now even across the country) turned their back on labor, why the state with the lowest per capita income and lowest median housing values, consistently generated the strongest support for the conservative faction. I did not, however, come up with more understanding of why the

OBAMA(ARE IN VIRGINIA -FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW

It seems we know a few things about Obamacare. Kids can stay on their parent's plan until they're 26. One cannot get kicked off any plan for a pre-existing condition. Women's health care is no extra cost. However, considering the coming election - here are some facts you may need to know.

WHAT ONE PAYS DEPENDS ON 5 THINGS -

- 1, Level of coverage.
- 2. Whether one qualifies for a subsidy.
- 3. Whether one is a resident Of Virginia.
- 4. Age
- 5. Whether one smokes.

LEVELS of COVERAGE

- 1. Platinum covers 90%
- 2. Gold covers 80%
- 3. Silver covers 70 %
- 4. Bronze covers 60% lowest monthly premium, but highest out of-pocket.

Any four carry the same essential benefits; including hospitalization, prescription drugs, maternity care and more. Categories do not affect amount of care.

CATASTROPHIC PLANS - if one is under age 30, catastrophic plans can be purchased at a lower cost than the bronze plan, however, there will be a payment of more medical cost up to a certain amount. This could be several thousand dollars, then costs are paid by insurance.

Out-of-pocket costs can be reduced if one meets eligibility requirements. The total amount of one's out-of-pocket costs, such as deductibles and co-pays will be reduced.

CHIP - low income individuals and families may qualify for free or low cost health care coverage, instead of Obamacare.

Age - cost of care will depend on this. Smoking -insurance companies can charge 50% more, but average is 20%.

IN RICHMOND -PROJECTED RATES :

Lowest Catastrophic -\$83.18 Lowest Bronze -\$133.03 Lowest Silver - \$179.64 2nd lowest Silver -\$198.01 Lowest Gold - \$203.24

Highest Silver & Gold not given. Let us hope our governor prevails in taking Medicaid coverage which will save Virginians millions. Know the facts, for these premiums are much lower than what many people are currently paying.
