# "LOOK! A BOOK"

It's been a tough year for all of us who love nothing better than settling into a comfy chair with a good book and maybe a libation and time on our hands. The death knell for many a bookstore has sounded this year and while there are good things to be said about Kindle and its clones. Kindle can't get me a latte and a scone and that's a crying shame. I guess what I'm trying to say is "Get thee to a bookstore and save a few jobs even if you have to switch to plain coffee and a mere biscotti."

The book I have chosen for review this month has been a little bit of a trial. I'm a long ways from that time in my life where intellectual pursuits were a lot easier. Gore Vidal's "Inventing a Nation" copyrighted in 2003 is not the easiest read, but it's also not the longest at 189 pages. The book deals with Washington, Adams and Jefferson as they struggled with their often opposed views of what this new nation should look like.

Washington comes off as a far more wise and diplomatic man than the last few decades have opined. Adams is brilliant without a doubt. but often a small man in more than height. For example, Adams once told someone that Washington was chosen Commander in Chief because, "He was always the tallest man in the room." Adams once wrote Jefferson that "You are apprehensive of monarchy, I of aristocracy. I would therefore have given more power to the President and less to the Senate."

Vidal gives a great deal of time to praising Benjamin Franklin who he maintains has been reduced by academic histories to "the jolly fat ventriloquist of common lore, with his maxims for simple folk," instead of a "dark prophet" who predicted our government would become so corrupt" as to give birth to that Despotic Government which he foresaw as inevitable at our birth."



While Adams was the great Federalist, Jefferson was the inspiration of the Republican Party, that being closer to what is now the Democratic Party and about as far away from today's Republican Party as you can get. Those opposing political philosophies were often stirred by the influence of Alexander Hamilton to whom Vidal gives a great deal of time.

Other topics dealt with are the foundations of the political conflicts that would lead to the Civil War, the history of the Monroe Doctrine, major Supreme Court issues, etc. I struggled a little with Vidal in the beginning, but as the book went on, he seemed more approachable and the topic easier to get into. If you've got an interest in political history, this is a great read. Growing up two miles from Mt. Vernon I was happy to see Washington treated with more respect than he has been treated in these last many years. And it was good to see a side of Jefferson we seldom see even if he doesn't appear Godlike as we in Virginia learned in our youth. Adams, what can I say. He's from Massachusetts.
