

#### **VOTING IN VIRGINIA**

Although the Supreme court ruled that section 4(b) of the Voting Rights Act is unconstitutional, and "covered jurisdictions" in states no longer need pre clearance before they change the voting rules, this does not change the voter I.D. requirements in Virginia at this time.

Voters can use the same I.D. they used before. This would be voter card, driver's license, utility bill, etc.

However, we do not know at this time if Virginia will try to change laws before the Presedential election. In this writer's opinion, the governor and the GOP candidate for governor really do not want any more negative attention on themselves in these matters.

Yet, Virginia still has an Act II. A quiet little drama concerning voter registration.

Virginia's new laws for voter registration:

- 1. The law LSB 1008 went into effect July 1, 2013.
- 2. To register voters, one must take 6 training classes.
- 3. The classes are in Richmond or online.
- 4. On line training is not yet available perhaps in a few weeks.

So, not much time and will the online site work? Those who registered voters never had to train before. So, do the math - 1. Short length of time to train; 2. Meet the state's schedule and requirements; 3. Maybe can't get it online due to glitches.

LOOK! A BOOK

This edition's book review is of "Ireland" by Frank Delaney, published in 2008. It's a novel with a wonderful history of Ireland painlessly, in fact, eloquently, woven into the tale. The author had a long career in BBC broadcasting before becoming a writer of both fiction and nonfiction and a BBC documentary, "The Celts."

It centers around an old man who may be the last of a dying breed. He is an itinerant story teller who tells tales of Irish history and heroes for bed and board. He owns only what he can carry and while educated enough to read and write, gains his stories mostly from those who have gone before as well as from what he picks up in libraries and his own keen observations of the human condition.

His own story is intertwined with that of a young man and his family, but he cannot yet reveal that story. An historical feast slowly reveals itself as the story teller travels his homeland. You'll learn of love and tragedy, laughter and hope, history and hypocrisy. In language that thrills the soul he takes you with him as he walks thousands of miles on roads that seem to go nowhere and everywhere at the same time.

On a personal note, at first I couldn't understand why I was so enthralled with the old man and his stories and then it hit me. My wonderful grandfather was an itinerant peddler of fruits and vegetables and country hams. And he was a Deane whose mother was a Donovan. While he couldn't read or write, boy could he tell stories!

In fact, every now and then he was interrupted by grandmother as their 16 grandchildren sat listening. "Hush, Eli!" They're too young for THAT story!

You know, when we don't listen to the stories of our elders, we lose so much. Do yourself a favor. Take a walk with Frank Delaney and the Storyteller. # WHERE DO WE GO FROM NOT GUILTY?

A mother and father lost their young son to a man who assumed he was up to no good, so pursued and confronted him, and when the confrontation went badly; he shot and killed him. As a parent of two young sons, I am worried for them and all the young men who happen to have skin that is a little bit darker.

So, what can be done? What do we do as a society to make race relations better in this country? It all starts with the conversation. In the aftermath of the jury decision, President Obama spoke truthfully and

eloquently about race. The President himself, being of biracial heritage, offers a unique perspective and is able to converse about race in a way that educates and does not alienate. Of course, I was disappointed by the reaction from the conservative right, who just never seem able to "Get it."

Nevertheless, the President gave us all the means in which to open a hearty and meaningful dialogue about race relations in this country. I for one, am going to take it to heart and really listen to people and try to understand their perspective.
