## LOOK! A BOOK!

Ever start a project and after a few hours wonder what the proverbial "H" you were thinking of? Well, how about reading almost 4,000 pages of a series of books on a subject you didn't heretofore really care all that much about... Namely, Winston Churchill, who wrote a six volume series of books entitled "World War II, the first one copyrighted in 1946 Over the years I kept seeing it in used book stores and each time I saw it I wanted it, but told myself I'd probably never read it, so why spend the money. Then I found five of the six books at a bargain price in paperback and thought I might read it, so what the heck. I started the first book and was hooked. The volumes were sold individually on Amazon and I was able to pick up the missing book. So, here I am a few weeks later, a lot smarter, much more aware of how much more there is to learn, still able to see relatively well with tired eyes

and happy to give my fellow Democrats a recommendation.

Churchill's personal history is fascinating. His mother was an American, and he was very proud of that, but make no mistake ,he was an Englishman! His love of country was readily evident in everything he did, and although a man of the aristocracy, he understood his people from the Royals to the rustics.

As Prime Minister and
Minister of Defense who came
up through the ranks of the
Government with a strong
military background in the
Navy, he understood both
sides of the political issues
that arose. His diplomatic
skills were constantly tested.
No one tested them more
than Stalin, yet no one
aggravated him more than
DeGaulle.

His books are structured around hundreds of messages (often l-o-o-o-ng messages) he received and responded to, and messages he initiated and received answers to. There were messages to and from

FDR, Stalin, both houses of Parliament, the generals, etc. His personal commentary in addition to the back and forth of the messages, kept things from being too dry or too military strategy oriented. He had the patience of Job, the wisdom of Solomon and the physical constitution of a much younger man. While he had not always been a great student. the education he received and his towering natural intellect completed the picture. He was a man of destiny - certainly not a god. But all the more amazing for his humanity.

World war II came alive in those books. Even though my father-in-law loved to talk about his experiences in the war, I never understood so many of the various aspects of the war in North Africa, how the Balkans fell under the Soviet yoke, why Japan hated us, why the English and the French had their difficulties, why it was so necessary for us to ration when we had plenty of food for our citizens and soldiers, etc.


