

The picnic was well attended, about 80 folks. A short movie was shown '"The Producers" Same cast, except they ran Trump for president. It was very funny and just what we needed.



LOOK! A BOOK!

As a confirmed bibliophile, I know I've read at least two books a week these last nine months Gary and I have been in Newport News. I'll admit many of them were mind candy, but this one was an amazing surprise and will be one that will be read over and over.

The book was published just last year and is the story of the Armed Services Editions (ASE) program to provide books to World War II service men. This book is so inspiring, I could quote from almost every paragraph, but then you wouldn't experience the joy and pride you're sure to feel as you tear through these less than 200 pages. So, I'll give you some points and quotes.

- A. 1933- Book burning, author denigration, and persecutions began with a vengeance in Berlin.
- B. When Helen Keller's books were burned, she wrote to

book burning student organizations: "History has taught you nothing if you think you can burn ideas."

- C. 1940-early 1941.

 American librarians decided the best defense against the Nazi War on Ideas were books themselves and encouraged Americans to read more. Book donations were solicited and were soon being donated at an amazing rate.
- D. Even before the U.S. entered the war, books were often the only entertainment available as the troops built training camps and later as they trained and waited for action.
- E. Pleasure reading, even comics, textbooks, and technical books were solicited and thousands of books were collected.
- F. The American Librarians Association created and secured funding for the National Defense Book Campaign.

- G. As the war went on, American Services Edition (ASE) were published in reduced size to meet the requirements of paper shortages and ink shortages.
- H. Servicemen's feedback was always welcome when books were chosen and their response to the donations was incredible.
- I. Thousands of books were printed every month and the families and friends put up with shortages of paper and ink so their loved d ones overseas could have free books.

Dog-eared and moldy and limp from the humidity those books go up online. Because they are what they are, because they can be packed in a hip pocket or stuck into a shoulder pack, men are reading where they've never read before.



"When books would come into the PX, libraries and duty stations, bundles were opened and books dumped into big bins or containers. Soldiers lined up as soon as the word got out. And if they did not immediately grab a book, the other men in line would urge each other on with the refrain, "No time to shop and look for titles. Grab a book, Joe. And keep going. You can swap later.

J. Politics entered the scene in 1944 when the Taft brothers tried to censor certain titles they thought might promote the reelection of Roosevelt to a fourth term. The Republicans became so paranoid that they threatened the entire ASE program. Republican censorship demands soon entered the realm of the frightening, and legislation eventually was adopted to return things to a reasonable outcome.

I hope these hints will whet your appetite for more info on this incredible program. When the war ended, millions of men had become enthusiastic readers. With the help of the GI Bill, millions more went to college and created educational opportunities for their children. And Joes and Joannes are still grabbing those books, and passing the knowledge up the line. Give this one a try. I promise you won't be disappointed and you'll be reminded how easily our hard won freedoms cost.


I was born in Connecticut.


That is why we must go out and register those voters. Make those calls. Ring those bells. We must do this for Hillary and for us.


The state of Washington had one office. Fourteen were in Trump Tower. He needed 200 staffers in Ohio, as of two weeks ago, he had fifty.

A face devoid of love or grace A hateful, hard, successful face,




