# NOTE FROM THE CHAIR



This bill passed - the Governor vetoed it.


Other bills, passed or came close - 20 week abortion law. After that - not happening. Many women don't even know they're pregnant at that date.

People's heads are spinning. The whole situation is hard to describe. It just feels like there is an alien interloper in the White House and it's all a scary dream.







# FLECTION VIRGINIA 2017


