President Obama "It's NOT class warfare - it's common sense!"

The Number 1 issue from now until November is **Election 2012!** For this month's Issues reminder I will shamelessly borrow from a recent column by Katrina Vanden Heuvel, editor and publisher of the Nation magazine. Ms. Vanden Heuvel put forth 3 issues that she believes could decide the election.

**First**, she has noted several efforts among the states to restrict voting rights with the goal of making it more difficult for certain groups (most notably minorities and young people) to vote. Examples: Requiring government-issued ID cards

Limiting or ending early voting
Disenfranchising citizens with criminal records

**Second**, Ms. Vanden Heuvel cites the rise of super PAC spending, a direct consequence of the 2010 *Citizens United* ruling. The ruling precludes the direct coordination of the PAC with the individual campaign but, that prohibition is virtually impossible to monitor and enforce.

Examples:

John Huntsman's father bankrolled his campaign. President Obama's super PAC is run by his former press secretary, Bill Burton who left that job to get involved with the 2012 campaign

**Third,** The Nation's editor puts forth her belief that the media is so obsessed with achieving balanced coverage that they are providing an atmosphere where no matter how flagrant the abuse of truth and fairness is by the Right, the media still feels obligated to find something bad about a Democrat. She calls this "false equivalence."

My conclusion: Of the above 3 issues, I believe the one we can do the most about is the first. Be on the lookout for any and all efforts to disenfranchise your fellow citizens. Make your voices heard wherever you believe someone is trying to silence someone else's. Make your dollars count and let your friends and family know that if they want to believe attack ads they might be better served by watching PBS. They could learn something and not have to suffer through the commercials. What a concept!

**State Issues** The original redistricting plan was passed by the House of Delegates, but a lawsuit has been filed asking the Justice Department to do it. You can track the progress at VPAP.org.

**Book Suggestion**: Watch this month's "Kicking News" where I'll do a review of "The Tipping Point." By Malcolm Gladwell. A very easy read that teaches a lot about things, people and ideas and how they reach a point where they take on an almost epidemic progression.

**Founding Fathers:** This month I'll include a longer than usual quote. This is in the spirit of "The more things change the more they remain the same." This is from a letter written by John Jay to Thomas Jefferson, Oct 1787.

"The inefficacy of our government becomes daily more and more apparent. Our treasury and our credit are in a bad situation; and it is probable that either the wisdom or the passions of the people will produce changes. A spirit of licentiousness has infected Massachusetts, which appears more formidable than some at first apprehended. Whether similar symptoms will not soon mark a like disease in several other States is very problematical.

The public papers herewith sent contain everything generally known about these matters. A reluctance to taxes, an impatience of government, a rage for property and little regard to the means of acquiring it, together with a desire of equality in all things, seem to actuate the mass of those who are uneasy in their circumstances. To these may be added the influence of ambitious adventurers, and the speculations of the many characters who prefer private to public good, and of others who expect to gain more from wrecks made by tempests than from the produce of patient and honest industry. As the knaves and fools of this world are forever in alliance, it is easy to perceive how much vigour and wisdom a government, from its construction and administration, should possess, in order to repress the evils which naturally flow from such copious sources of injustice and evil.

Much, I think, is to be feared from the sentiments which such a state of things is calculated to infuse into the minds of the rational and well-intended. In their eyes, the charms of liberty will daily fade; and in seeking for peace and security, they will too naturally turn towards systems in direct opposition to those which oppress and disquiet them.

If faction should long bear down law and government, tyranny may raise its head, or the more sober part of the people may even think of a king.

In short, my dear sir, we are in a very unpleasant situation. Changes are necessary; but, what they ought to be, what they will be, and how and when to be produced, are arduous questions. I feel for the cause of liberty, and for the honour of my countrymen who have so nobly asserted it, and who, at present, so abuse its blessings. If it should not take root in this soil, little pains will be taken to cultivate it in any other."

reviewing the law is Texas and South Carolina for compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act. In November, Mississippi voters approved an amendment requiring a photo ID, but it must be implemented by the legislature and would not take affect until 2014.

AARP also states that seventeen states require voters to show non-photo ID at the polls. Documents that are acceptable are voter registration, Social Security card, utility bill or gun permit. These states are: Alaska, Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Kentucky, Missouri, Montana, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Utah, Virginia, and Washington State. There are twenty-one states that require no ID. No, I'm not going to name all of those states but you can determine who they are since I already named the other states. The Obama reelection campaign, the Congressional Black Caucus, and Democratic groups are working diligently to fight the new voting laws. There are much litigations challenging these laws as I'm sure you are aware. But, we must be aware because we have been and probably will be involved in voter registration. When we do register a new voter, we must make that person aware of the requirements for the state of Virginia.

#### Look! A Book by: DIANE SIBLEY

This month's book review will be on The <u>Tipping Point</u> by Malcolm Gladwell. This is a study of how major changes in society so often appear to happen suddenly and unexpectedly. Many ideas, messages, etc. can actually start off slowly and suddenly reach a threshold of acceptance or perception of need that fuel an intense acceleration of popularity. That threshold is the "tipping point."

While a great deal of the book deals with products and why they suddenly become so much in demand, the concept of a tipping point also applies to social situations. Ideas can spread like a social epidemic. Gladwell maintains that ideas have contagiousness, some ideas are more "sticky" than others and that other ideas need to be put into the right context for the tipping point to be realized. He also suggests that little causes can have big effects.

An example how a tipping point might be reached is the situation that brought Barack Obama to the public eye. When a young Barack Obama spoke at a Democratic Convention, listeners were impressed and talked to each other and the word spread. A dramatic point was soon reached that put him in the spotlight enough to be considered as a potential candidate for the presidency. A tipping point turned into a groundswell

Another proposal of Gladwell's is that there is a "Law of the Few." There are people he calls "connectors" who have some combination of curiosity, self-confidence, sociability and energy which allow them to span many different "worlds."

A fascinating segment of the book discusses a study that was done in 1984 on how people are influenced by television. The three major network news anchors were observed as they spoke about Reagan and Mondale. While the words were truly unbiased, the facial expressions of the anchors showed "significant and noticeable bias." Later voters were polled as to how they voted. Viewers who watched the two network anchors who looked about the same when they spoke about either candidate tended to vote in proportional numbers for each candidate. But viewers of the one network anchor whose facial expression lit up when speaking of Reagan voted in a very disproportional number for Reagan. Are we as voters that pliable?

There are many more studies in the book that are just as interesting, but you'll have to read the book. Based on what I read, I sure hope our campaign advisors and the powers that be already had that pleasure.
