There will be a new way to vote this November. You will be given a paper ballot and special pencil. Your choice will be a circle that is bubbled in. Be SURE to completely fill in the circle. There are also 3 amendments on the ballot. Go to our website where they are posted. It is important to be ready to vote, as there is only one hard copy reader machine available, so this could cause lines as you wait to deposit your ballot.

If you are concerned about secrecy, you can hold the ballot close to you. You will have a corral in which to vote, but there will be no machine there.

This plan was created in Richmond, reasons unknown. Although, I believe it was mentioned that there was a fear of voting fraud with the machines. The paper ballots can be hand counted if need be- this is why I strongly suggest you fill in the circle completely. We want no doubt about the vote cast.

DONKEY/ELEPHANT HISTORY

President Andrew Jackson was the first Democrat to be associated with the donkey symbol. His opponents, during the 1828 election, tried to label him a "jackasss" for his populist beliefs and slogan, "Let the people rule." Jackson found the whole thing entertaining and used it to his advantage in campaign posters.

However, cartoonist Thomas Nast is given credit for making the donkey the recognizable symbol of the Democratic party. The first cartoon was in "Harper's Weekly" in 1870. It was supposed to represent an anti-Civil War faction, but the public was already taken with it and by 1880 the donkey was the official symbol.

Thomas Nast is also responsible for the elephant, which appeared in "Harper's Weekly" in 1874. Nast drew a donkey dressed in lion's skin, which promptly scared away all the animals in the zoo. One animal was the elephant, which he labeled the Republican vote". So, the elephant became the GOP.

URANIUM MINING IN VIRGINIA - UPDATE

The Hampton Roads Planning District which represents 16 Virginia cities and many counties wants the General Assembly to keep a 30 year ban on uranium mining in place. Their resolution will be presented to state departments studying the mining and to State legislators.

The primary concern is pollution of public water supplies, and a concern about radioactive waste.

Virginia Uranium Mining, Inc. wants an end to the ban. There are 119 million pounds in Pittsylvania county. The company says it can mine them safely and provide many jobs.

This process involves separating ore from rock and makes tons of waste. The company says it will use below ground cells to store the waste.

Virginia Uranium Mining says the National Academy of Sciences study showed this type of storage will eliminate risks to drinking water.

However, The NAS study concluded, Virginia faced "steep hurdles" before it could regulate uranium mining to protect public health and the environment.
