BLUE POWER !!!!!!!!


WORDS FROM THE CHAIR

I would like to think there is something in the word "Commonwealth" that makes us Virginians a little special. After all we did spawn more than our share of Presidents. Unfortunately, we also have to acknowledge the McDonnels and others of their ilk. And we don't forget to give credit to that other Commonwealth. Massachusetts, for the Adams Boys and others from that original tea party gang. While perusing my library, cum sunroom, cum guest room for this edition's "Look! A Book" I happened across Gore Vidal's "Inventing a Nation -Washington, Adams, Jefferson,"

As one who took Virginia
History every year from 1st
Grade to Graduation, I
wondered if I could stand one
more go at it? I had heard
Vidal speak once and I was so
turned off by his arrogance
and lock-jawed speaking style
that I was very prone to dislike
the book on those grounds
alone.

But, Thank Goodness, I persevered and Lo and Behold, what a treasure. The book makes you feel like a fly on the wall that flits from meeting rooms to dining rooms to halls that hosted some of the greatest minds of the Revolution and then to the depths of political machinations. Many powerful men, both civilian and military, parade through these rooms on the way to the creation of a country. Even Abigail Adams sounds like she could hold her own in any discussion with the boys.

You'll learn lots of new things about a lot of people you thought you knew about, but now maybe not so much. Did you know that Alexander Hamilton was a very scary man? He was a favorite of Washington and used it to get his way?

He was pro-monarchy, pronational bank, pro-anything that would gather unto himself power and glory. Washington loved the man who was like a son to him, but kept an eye on him just in case.

Washington has taken a bad rap these last few decades, but our homegrown hero set a standard of behavior that I can't believe any politician of our generation could surpass today. When he refused to accept the presidency of a Virginia/Maryland company to develop the navigability of the Potomac River, the appeal won his acceptance only if they would donate all the dividends of his shares to charities. He avoided many conflicts by an astute assessment of any problems that arose and then acted quickly to resolve them, often at Hamilton's astonishment and other's frustration.

Even King George had to admit that if that story was true, "He will be the greatest man in the world."

A great deal of the book deals with discussions of the new Constitution. Vidal's comments are cogent and the different opinions addressed in a writing style that is surprisingly easy to follow and understand. One can easily see the threats if they get it wrong and the rewards (both to the citizens and to themselves) if they get it right. John Adams always has the best interests of the country at heart, but frequently comes across as a petulant whiner. I think Jefferson might have come across the same way if he had been a New Englander. He was raised up high on his mountain, but not quite high enough to think he ruled from Olympus.

Jefferson hated politics, but he felt he had to participate to protect the farmer citizens from those big bad Northern merchants. Adams believed the colonies only chance of survival was to have a strong Federal government. Their long standing feud only faded to the background as they reached old age. Adam's Federalist's eventually became the Republican Party and Jefferson's wing of the Republicans became the Democratic Party.

With the completion of the Constitution in 1787, Hamilton was selected to "sell" it to the people. A republic was created "if we can keep it", said Benjamin Franklin.

As I went back through the book to see if there were a few more points I should include, I quickly realized that virtually every page had information that every citizen would do well to be aware of. It's a short book, less that 200 pages, but what an education! I honestly think any kid at 7th grade level or above can comprehend it. Of course. I went to Virginia schools. (Sorry, I couldn't resist it.)

I have a new respect for Mr. Vidal, author of "Inventing a Nation..." published in 2003 by R.R. Donnelly, Harrison, Virginia.

BRYCE REEVES - SENATE BILLS

We keep wondering what legislation Bryce Reeves is sponsoring. Many say he is doing very little. I looked into this on the Senate web site. I found over 30 bills he has placed with many cosponsored. There were so many, I chose two I found of interest.

SB25 -co-patron -Tom Garret (Lynchburg R.) Off Shore Natural Gas and Royalties. Establishment of Virginia Energy Emergency Response Fund and Community College Energy Exploration and Development Fund. This sets out the recipients proportion and payments for the distribution of royalties received by the Commonwealth as a result of offshore gas and oil drilling and exploration.

It directs the first 50 million -to the Offshore Emergency Response Fund. 20% to Transportation; 10% to Virginia Coast of Emergency Research Consortium; 20% to Department of Environmental Quality; 40% to General Fund. Some of this to be applied to Port of Virginia Infrastructure and Economic Zone.

Passed by House and Senate Not signed by Governor.

My Note: Are all these agencies newly created by this bill? Looks like Mr. Reeves is preparing for "drill baby drill", as far as I know this is not yet done on a large scale off Virginia's shores. Lots of funds, lots of emergencies, lots of money being allocated to agencies with long names.

SB 97 - co patrons - Jeff McWaters (Virginia Beach R); Chap Peterson - Fairfax R) Minimum clearance for passing a bicycle increased from 2 to 3 feet. MY NOTE: Picture passing like this in the Lake - 2 lane road -one size does not fit all -KABOOM!

And who enforces this with a ruler? Passed by both houses - NOT signed by Governor.

NEW (OMMITMENTS TO IMPROVE (OLLEGE OPPORTUNITY

- 1. The White House announces the second College Opportunity Summit set for December 4, 2014. This year's summit will focus on building strong K-12 schools and higher education partnerships to encourage college enrollment.
- 2. New community college partners working to expand college opportunity: The Administration is announcing 14 new commitments by community colleges by strengthening college readiness for academically under prepared students.
- 3. New commitments from the field to strengthen college readiness: The Department of Education's Institute for Educational Studies (IES) is launching a new center for the analysis of Post Secondary Readiness (CAPR) led by the Community College Research Center (CRCC) at Teacher's College, Columbia University and the social policy research organization(MDRC) that will work to strengthen, evaluation, and support

of college-readiness efforts across the nation. Kahn Academy will focus on technology-based solutions customized to improve student success in developmental math.

4. Continued progress on ongoing college opportunity commitments: There are efforts to expand access to college for all students. To enhance support for all school counselors. To boost student achievement in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. This effort is to extend to females and students from low income or underserved communities. You go President Obama!
